an examination of a series of diverse radical and experimental international works from the 1950s to the present what is a literary work in literature s elsewheres annette gilbert tackles this question by deploying an extended concept of literature examining a series of diverse radical experimental works from the 1950s to the present that occupy the liminal zone between art and literature these works by american artist allison parrish natalie czech stephanie syjuco fiona banner elfriede jelinek dan graham robert barry george brecht and others represent a pluralized literary practice that imagines a different literature emerging from its elsewheres investigating a work s coming into being its transition from text to work as a social object and pragmatic category of literary communication gilbert probes the assumptions and foundations that underpin literature including the ideologies and power structures that prop it up she offers a snapshot from a period of recent literary and art history when such central concepts as originality and authorship were questioned and experimental literary practices ranged from concrete poetry and oulipo to conceptual writing and appropriation literature she examines works that are dematerialized site specific unique copies of other works and institutional critiques considering the inequalities exclusions and privileges inscribed in literature she documents the power of experimental literature to attack these norms and challenges the field s canonical geographic boundaries by examining artists with roots in north and south america east asia and western and eastern europe the cross pollination of literary and art criticism enriches both fields with literature s elsewheres

a compelling quest to locate a history and poetics of the american sentence this book applies four stages of communication to the story of american writing the sermon the telegraph the newspaper and the screen to ask what is an american sentence and how has it changed while sentences have become the subject of their own form literary histories cultural narratives and personal writings have not centred on the sentence as a singular object there is no history of the sentence this book addresses that absence reviewing american style through american literary history for evolutionary moments in the development of the american sentence from the puritans to the present day reading sentences from writers as diverse as benjamin franklin henry james gertrude stein lydia davis cormac mccarthy and colson whitehead we find ourselves asking if a poetics of the american sentence actually exists whether good sentences are the reason we read and what the future of the american sentence might be

though canon concerns seem to be a relic of 1990s academia we are once again at a historical moment when there is resistance to teaching texts by writers of color and texts that deal with race ethnicity and gender at the same time algorithmic bias scholars are locating systemic bias encoded into systems from policing software to housing software bringing these divergent areas together amy e earhart examines how technological and institutional infrastructures

construct and deconstruct race ethnicity and gender identities focusing on two central infrastructures the database a commonly used technological infrastructure in the digital humanities and the anthology a scholarly and pedagogical infrastructure earhart considers how such seemingly naturalized infrastructures impact the representation and modeling of identity the book draws upon the building and use of data a collection of almost 100 years of generalist american and african american literature anthologies constructed to investigate questions of identity and representation in literary anthologies and by extension the larger literary canon the resulting examination and its rigorous discussion of how identities are created and recreated within black literary histories has important implications for contemporary cultural and political debates about canon formation literary scholarship and the bias embedded in technological infrastructures
